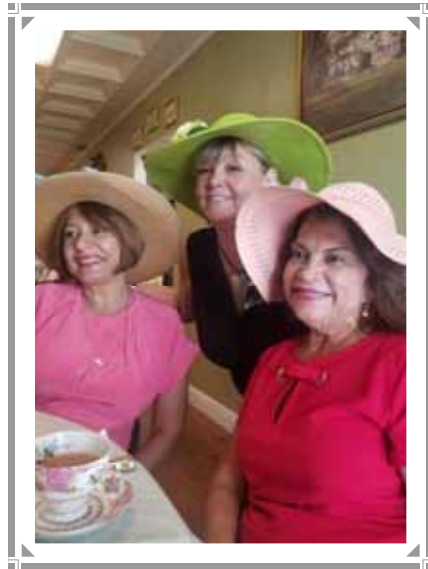

October is breast cancer awareness month. Please wear pink to the next general meeting if possible and during the month.

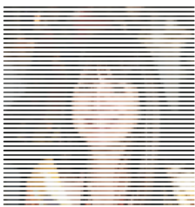

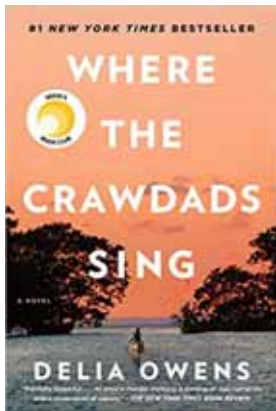
