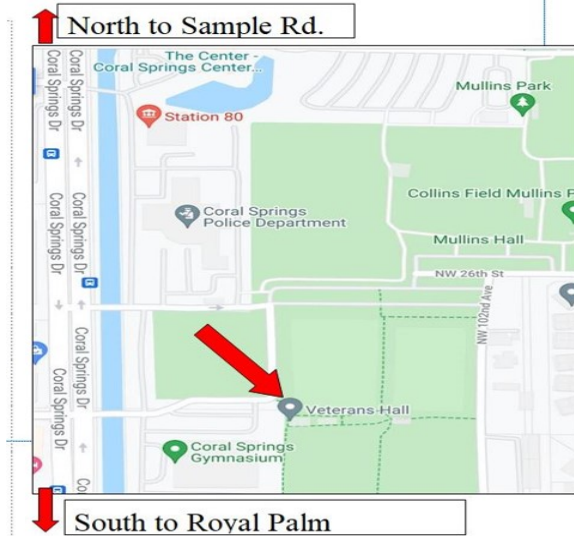

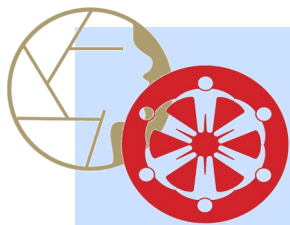
HWC member, Carole Soler, will be teaching this class and she is known for her submissions to GFWC Florida's Art Competition over the last couple of years.

The cost for this event is \$20 per person and the wine glass will be provided. Please bring a of snack for the attendees to enjoy after the completion of their wine glass art.

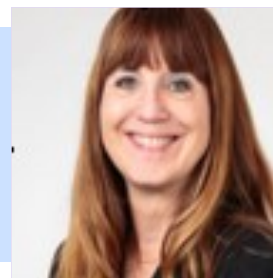

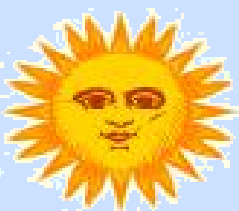

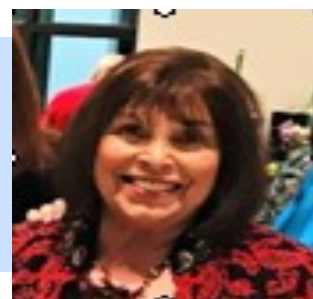
